# JESUS THE LAMB OF GOD

**SCRIPTURAL LESSON:** *John 1:29-34*

### GOSPEL TRUTH:

Our Lord Jesus Christ is the Lamb of God who was sacrificed for the sins of all mankind. Easter is the Passover which speaks of Calvary, and the redemption by blood from Egypt (signifying the world) and from Pharaoh (signifying the devil) as well as from Egyptian servitude (a type of sin). *Exodus 12:13* states, “. . . and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt.” Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, is our Passover (*I Peter 1:19-21*).

### GOLDEN SCRIPTURE:

*The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world (John 1:29).*

### THE APOSTOLIC FAITH CHURCH DOCTRINES:

1. At the Passover, Jesus Christ took bread, and said, “. . . Take, eat; this is my body. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying Drink ye all of it; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins” (*Matthew 26:26-28*).
2. On the Cross of Calvary, Jesus Christ said, “I thirst.” “When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head and gave up the ghost” (*John 19:28, 30*).
3. Joseph of Arimathea besought Pilate for the body of Jesus. He and Nicodemus wound it in linen clothes and spices. They laid Jesus in the garden where there was a new sepulchre, where no man was yet laid (*John 19:38-42*).

4. Mary Magdalene stood outside the sepulchre and wept. “*Jesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, Master.*” Jesus told her to go and tell the brethren that “. . . I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to my God, and your God” (*John 20:17-17*).
5. The risen Lord Jesus Christ said to Thomas, “*Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing.*” Jesus tells us that blessed are those who have not seen yet believe on Him (*John 20:27*).

### BACKGROUND SETTING:

Jesus Christ is mankind’s only Savior, who was crucified, and buried on Good Friday, and resurrected on Easter Sunday, giving mankind salvation, and redemption from the penalty of sin. *Romans 10:9* states, “*That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.*” As believing saints we were baptized in water (signifying His death, burial, and resurrection) in the name of Jesus Christ, and filled with God’s Holy Spirit, speaking in God’s unknown tongue (*John 3:1-7; Acts 2:38, 4:12*).

### LESSON SUMMARY:

Of all the religious leaders in the world, our Lord Jesus Christ is the only God that became a man. The others were just men, who died, like Jesus, but they remain dead and buried. Only Jesus Christ was resurrected, leaving an empty tomb. Jesus Christ spent 40 days instructing His Apostles, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God, and saying, “*But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight*” (*Acts 1:8-9*).
