

**TELEVISION SERMON FOR  
SUNDAY APRIL 15, 2018  
“LOOK DEEPER INTO GOD’S WORD”  
HEAD PASTOR BILLY HAN, JR.**

Thank you, Jose!

There are a countless number of people, who have the mistaken notion that they are saved, having been baptized a long time ago in their respective churches. They find it hard to believe, when they are told years later, that in fact, they are not saved, since they were baptized in the titles, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, instead of in the Name of Jesus. Whether you are young or old, television viewers, I pray that my sermon, entitled, "LOOK DEEPER INTO GOD'S WORD" will help you to realize the importance of the Name, "JESUS," in your personal salvation and give you the opportunity to correct your predicament, if you were baptized in any other term, except the name of "JESUS." After all, God maintains, "If you deny Jesus, you deny the Father, but if you have Jesus, then you have the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

Hebrews 4:12 proclaims, "For the Word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of the soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

God's Word is quick, powerful, and sharper causing Jesus Christ to look deep within our hearts, as the Almighty God, and Creator. Jesus Christ will chastise us, to make us right in His sight, so that we will be able to enjoy sweet fellowship with Him upon this earth.

God's Word, through the Prophet Isaiah, reveals Jesus Christ as our ever-living Savior, and Word of God, Whose Word is infallible and eternal. Isaiah 40:8 reads, "The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever."

Today, God's Word denotes the Gospel of the Kingdom of God for our edification in I Peter 1:23-25, "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever. For all flesh is as grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of grass. The grass withereth, and the flower thereof falleth away. But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you."

Psalms 119:140 describes why we love God's Word, "Thy word is very pure: therefore, thy servant loveth it."

God's Word also compelled this nobleman whose son was sick at Capernaum to take Jesus Christ, the Word of God, at His Word in John 4:47-53, "When he heard that Jesus was come out of Judaea into Galilee, he went unto him, and besought him that he would come down, and heal his son: for he was at the point of death. Then Jesus said unto him, Except ye see signs and wonders, ye will not believe.

The nobleman saith unto him, Sir, come down ere my child die. Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way. And as he was now going down, his servants met him, and told him, saying, Thy son liveth. Then inquired he of them the hour when he began to amend. And they said unto him, Yesterday at the

seventh hour the fever left him. So the father knew that it was at the same hour, in the which Jesus said unto him, "Thy son liveth: and himself believed, and his whole house."

Hebrews 11:1-3 and 6 defines faith to every man, woman, and child that is required to love the Lord Jesus Christ, "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. For by it the elders obtained a good report. Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear. But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him."

We increase our faith when we daily look deeper into God's Word per Romans 10:17, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."

God's biblical honor roll identifies the Saints of God who lived, endured, and died in the faith. Their testimony of faith is a living testimony to every man, woman and child to also live for Jesus Christ today.

Let me share a piece of advice... "Never ask your friends, or loved ones how to get to heaven because the only right answer is found in God's Word in I Peter 2:1-3, "Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings, As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: If so be ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious."

We will continue to grow in wisdom, knowledge and understanding by reading God's Word as confirmed in II Timothy 3:14-17, "But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness. That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works."

God's Word instructs mankind in righteousness, life, death, and eternal life to thereby increase our love and faith in Christ Jesus. In the Bible, we read about a scholarly Pharisee named Nicodemus who approached Jesus Christ to ask Him about the miraculous power displayed during His preaching, and teaching.

Let us listen in to their conversation in John 3:5 to him, "...Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." And the 7th verse, "Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again."

Nicodemus learned the Good News that, "Jesus Saves; Jesus Heals; Jesus Baptizes With The Holy Ghost, And With Fire; and Jesus Is Coming Soon."

Romans 3:22-23 points out to every man, woman and child that we are all sinners in God's eyes, "Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference: For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God."

Nicodemus recalled the scripture written in Romans 3:10-11, "As it is written, there is none righteous, no, not one: There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God."

He also remembered the scripture in Isaiah 64:6, "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away."

Many today still do not believe in Jesus Christ as described in Romans 10:3-4, "For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone that believeth."

Accepting Jesus Christ as our personal Savior, Master and Lord, and being baptized by immersion in water in the name of Jesus Christ, and being filled with His Holy Spirit will impart God's righteousness to us through Jesus Christ as God, Himself.

The new birth grows out of the incapacity of the natural man, woman, and child to see or enter into the Kingdom of God. No matter how gifted, or morally refined, mankind is absolutely blind to God's Spiritual truths.

Therefore, mankind by himself is impotent and incapable of entering into the Kingdom of God, nor obeying, understanding, or pleasing God. Mankind, being separated from God, is dead in trespasses and sins, and therefore, cannot enter into Heaven.

We need new lives, cleansed from the penalty of sin, and we must be born again into a new life as described by Christ Jesus in John 10:10, "I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly."

To be born again is to take on the new birth, and new life that every man, woman, and child will obtain when they accept Jesus Christ as their personal Savior, Master, and Lord.

Jesus Christ proclaims in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." The question is, "How do we become a member of God's Holy Family?"

The answer is found in Acts 2:38, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

Repentance is to have Godly sorrow for our sin. To be born again is to be baptized by immersion in water, in the name of Jesus Christ. And to be born of the Spirit is to receive God's Holy Spirit as confirmed when we speak in tongues, God's unknown language.

Acts 2:4 provides this evidence witnessed on the Day of Pentecost in Jerusalem, "And that they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak in tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance."

The name of Jesus Christ is the only key to be saved, and receive remission of sins as confirmed in Acts 4:12, "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."

Therefore, every man, woman, and child can conclude that Jesus Christ is God's only Savior, Master and Lord, the Almighty God, Himself, who is God's sacrificial Lamb for this lost and dying world.

The new birth does not reform the old man. The new birth performs the creative act within mankind that brings about remission of sins by the Blood of Jesus Christ shed on the Cross of Calvary.

We believe in Christ crucified, and through Jesus Christ we become partakers of His Divine nature meaning Christ living within every man, woman, and child as their hope of glory.

Three important steps denote the process to increase our love and faith in Christ Jesus, and thereby cause all mankind to look deeper into the Holy, and precious Word of God.

The first step is to become a Prayer Warrior. Prayer is the strength of the Gospel and daily prayer moves the mighty hand of God that moves the world. Doing so, we will then resonate the familiar words, "Deeper yet I pray, and higher everyday in Jesus Christ, and His perfect will." The power of prayer is God's mighty weapon that will open our eyes to be able to look deeper with Spiritual understanding into God's Holy and precious Word.

This is confirmed in Ephesians 6:10 and 17-18, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints."

The second step is becoming a participant in the Gospel of the Kingdom of God. Looking deeper into God's Word may bring hard trials upon us, but that should only encourage us to say to Jesus Christ, "Deeper let me go, Dear Lord."

Our participation in the Lord's Gospel work means getting more involved with Jesus Christ, putting our shoulders to the Gospel Wheel, and helping to push the Gospel work on to greater heights and greater measures.

Simply put, it means making ourselves, ready, willing and available in the service of the King. We must have a God-willing heart, and a God-willing mind.

In the parable of the rich young ruler, Jesus Christ instructed him saying in Luke 18:22-27, "Now when Jesus heard these things, he said unto him, Yet lackest thou one thing: sell all that thou hast, and distribute unto the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, and follow me. And when he heard this, he was very sorrowful: for he was very rich.

And when Jesus saw that he was very sorrowful, he said, How hardly shall they that have riches enter into the Kingdom of God! For it is easier for a camel to go through a needle's eye, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God. And they that heard it said, Who then can be saved? And he said, The things which are impossible with men are possible with God."

Jesus Christ today wants to take all of our efforts, and resources, and use them to produce glorious miracles in His Gospel work so that many more souls will come, and be saved.

The third step is to become a faithful believer. Looking deeper and higher as faithful believers every day in Jesus Christ will enable us to push ahead until all conflict is past.

Doing so, we will surely find ourselves walking the walk, and talking the talk in the image of Jesus Christ, becoming perfected in our every step. Our believing faith will enable us to look deeper, and walk higher in the love of Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ chose this beautiful seashore with two fishing boats drawn up on shore with their sails tied down, and their sailors moving tiredly about mending their nets. He used Peter's boat as His Pulpit to teach the multitude of people who pressed closer to hear Him preach the Word of God from the ship.

We pick-up this scripture reading in Luke 5:4-8, "Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net. And when they had this done, they enclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink.

When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, Depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord. For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of the fishes which they had taken."

Simon Peter's faithful listening to the Lord Jesus Christ is worthy of our own Spiritual inspiration. It speaks of taking the next deeper step of faith with holy boldness to look deeper, and enter into a deeper understanding of the inner most parts of God's precious Holy Word.

Peter's faithful response to Jesus Christ caused the Lord to use Peter as a great fisher of men in His Gospel Work. We see here how Jesus Christ dealt with His Chief Apostle, Simon Peter, and the words of Jesus Christ still pertain personally to every true born again Christian today, as well as all unbelievers.

Jesus Christ encourages every man, woman, and child to launch out into the depths of His precious Holy Word to find every answer to life's challenges, and to ultimately gain eternal life in heaven above.

The personal example of Peter is a strong warning to each and every one of us to put Jesus Christ first in our lives. Doing so will bring about the scriptural reference found in Psalms 51:3-5, "For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me. Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done this evil in thy sight: that thou mightest be justified when thou speakest, and be clear when thou judgest. Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me."

The dialogue between Jesus Christ, and Simon Peter in John 21:15-17 instructs every one to love Jesus Christ with our whole heart, mind, soul and might. It reads, "So when they had dined, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me more than these? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my lambs. He saith to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my sheep. He saith unto him the third time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? Peter was grieved because he said unto him the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, Feed my sheep."

Jesus Christ is likewise instructing His Preachers today as well, to feed His lambs and feed His sheep with His precious Holy Word. We must preach the Gospel of the Kingdom of God to feed and nurture new souls, lambs, and sheep in His sheepfold.

Let us therefore, put forth the courage and faith to be like Peter who launched out into the deep to become a significant leader in the Church, and never looked back again, even unto the end.

Let us be ready, willing and available to tell others about the love of Jesus Christ and His Holy Word. Then, we too, will be drawn deeper into God's Word, and will be able to move deeper, higher, and wiser in the love of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, who is coming soon to call us home saying, "Come Up Hither."
