Molokai Branch Church Celebrated “82 Years of Good News”

It was truly an exercise in persistence and faith for Head Pastor Billy and Sister Roslyn Han, Jr., saints and friends from across the waters, and the saints of God on Molokai to gather in the House of God on Sunday, March 22, 2026 to celebrate the 82nd Anniversary of the Molokai Branch Church located in the hills of Kaunakakai.

The worst weather in thirty years had caused major airline cancellations and rescheduling. Heavy rains, flooding, major streams overflowing caused such hindrances. The hope was to wait “till the storm passes over,” but that was not to be. The Saints of God persisted trusting in the Lord and the anniversary service came to fruition commencing at 10:00 a.m. on a rainy Sunday morning.

The celebration commenced with “The Lord’s Prayer,” led by Head Pastor Billy Han, Jr. followed by a rousing

The Saints of God continued to praise and thank our Lord Jesus Christ for His Showers of Blessings, at the 82nd Molokai Branch Church Anniversary Service on Sunday, March 22, 2026.

The musical program concluded, and Head Pastor Billy Han, Jr. then proceeded with his sermon: “82 Years of Good News.” It was a declaration of history, thanksgiving, purpose and definition of the Gospel, the Good News that Jesus Saves, Jesus Heals, Jesus Baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire, and Jesus is Coming Soon. He recalled the generosity of Sister Christina Lima’s donation of the land for the church in Pukoo. He related how the mission on Molokai had begun in the home of the late Pastor Gus Nihoa at his homestead in Hoolehua. It was on March 26, 1944 that the first Molokai Branch Church, located in Pukoo, was dedicated to the glory of God; the only church built of all new building and construction material during the war years. In July 1964, Pastor Rodney Asano, Sr. was raised up as the Pastor for the church in Kaunakakai. On August 3, 1997, Pastor Reginald V. Castanares was ordained and raised up as Pastor for the Molokai Branch Church.

It was time for the *Word of God* to go forth. Head Pastor Billy Han, Jr.’s sermon declared “Rejoice In The Lord” a message of joy, peace and rejoicing. Every morning, he

declared, “Wake up and Praise the Lord.” Constant joy will come as we separate ourselves from the world for Jesus will give us His unmatched peace, “...which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus” (Philippians 4:7). “...for the joy of the LORD is your strength” (Nehemiah 8:10).

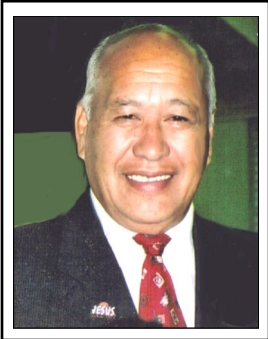
Head Pastor Han implored the saints to stay with the Lord always; do not go away; for God knows all and sees all; works out every thing in His own way, on His own timing, and it is the perfect time, knowing that if God be for us, who can be against us. The Lord is at hand; be kind, be considerate; live lives that exude the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22, 25): “...love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance...” for “If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit” of Jesus. Jesus gives peace that the world cannot take away and which never dies. “Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid” (John 14:27). Follow the Lord, stay in His light! Follow the Word! Acts 16:25-34 related the experience of Paul and Silas, imprisoned with no means of escape released by the power of God. Surely, as long as we stay and walk with the Lord, He is always there to deliver us! The invitation went forth to choose Jesus and believe and obey the Gospel. Head Pastor Han expounded on the Gospel: “Jesus Saves, Jesus Heals, Jesus Baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire and Jesus Is Coming Soon!” (Mark 1:14-15, John 3:3-7, Acts 2:38, Acts 4:12, Acts 2:1-4). He encouraged the Saints to stop being overly anxious or over worrying knowing WHO will work everything out. Mark 10:27 gives hope: “And Jesus looking upon them saith, With men it is impossible, but not with God: for with God all things are possible.” Knowing this gives us great cause to rejoice. His concluding scriptures brought it all home. Psalms 144:15, “Happy is that people, that is in such a case: yea, happy is that people, whose God is the LORD.” Yes, happiness is the Lord and comes from the Lord. Psalms 95:1-2: “O COME, let us sing unto the LORD: let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation. Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, and make a joyful noise unto him with psalms.” Philippians 4:1, “THEREFORE, my brethren dearly beloved and longed for, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved.” “Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say Rejoice” (Philippians 4:4).

The service concluded with the singing of “When We All Get To Heaven” and a benediction by Head Pastor Billy Han, Jr. We thank the Lord for the *Word of God*, the sweet fellowship enjoyed by all; for safekeeping; for the labors of love of the Saints and for prayers and answers to prayer and for the sumptuous feast that fol-

Gospel message

“It Is Finished”

The Son of Man came to find lost people and save them (Luke 19:8-9). Salvation came to Zacchaeus because of his faith. Luke’s gospel stresses the urgency covering the work of Christ Jesus. “For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost” (Luke 19:10). For one sinner Jesus would lay down His life, estimating the value of a soul.

All of our problems and troubles are caused by sin, leaving pain in the human heart. Even before sin raised its difficult challenge to life, God set basic instructions and warning creating a shield and an armour for Adam and Eve in Eden (from the betrayal of trust and persuasion without guidance). Life didn’t go awry until they chose to yield doing the right thing to God’s clear warning. At that time in history all matters about their surroundings took a drastic change. There has never been a sinless person except Jesus Christ, the sinless Son of God, because we have sinned we are lost. “For the wages of sin is death” (Romans 6:23). “...the soul that sinneth, it shall die” (Ezekiel 18:4). Jesus was the Divine Son of God performing miracles and overcoming death.

Jesus and the Nicodemus connection states in John 3:1-7, “There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews: The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him. Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter the second time into his mother’s womb, and be born? Verily, verily I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God...”

It illustrates the inability of this religious leader to acknowledge the spiritual truth articulated by Jesus. The Pharisees were the religious leaders of the Jewish nation of which Nicodemus was a high ranking member, a ruler of the Jews. He came to see Jesus by night probably do to self interest and spiritual blindness of divine things. After the cleansing of the temple there must have been strong hostility against Jesus. Nicodemus was ready to admit the truth that Jesus was a teacher sent from God, because of the miracles he witnessed. But Jesus added a completely novel idea to be born again is to be born anew from above. Nicodemus was perplexed. He knew that a man cannot be born over again in a physical sense. Jesus described the new birth in terms of water and spirit. Water may well refer to water baptism by immersion and regenerating power of the Spirit (Titus 3:5) You must be born again in Jesus’ name according to Acts 2:38, “Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.” In Acts 4:12 it also states, “Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.”

This is a universal requirement. Baptism in Jesus’ name by

emersion in water and filled with His Holy Spirit is a requirement to obtain eternal life through Christ Jesus.

Unlike others who may have died for some noble cause, Jesus died to save mankind and bring them to join Him in heaven. (John 14:2-3) He had the power to lay down His life and the authority to take it up again (John 10:17-18; 15:13).

Six long hours Jesus hung upon that cross. Finally at approximately three o’clock in the afternoon, through hours of anguish and intense suffering, pain and distress He cried out “It is finished” (John 19:30). Jesus risked all for our redemption.

What Jesus promised in His death, He made a way for the freeing of guilt and sin. Completing the embodiment of salvation for all humanity thus Jesus accomplished His appointed mission of eternal redemption for all.

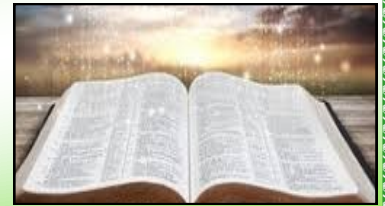

Editorial

“Jesus Christ, our Redeemer”

I was pleasantly surprised to look up the word “redeemer” in one of the available dictionaries and found the definition of “Jesus Christ is regarded as the savior of humanity through His death on the Cross.” In the Old Testament, a redeemer is defined as one who bought back one’s debt, penalty or avenged the wrongs done to his kinsman or relative. Jesus, no

doubt, fits this definition.

There are many songs that portray Jesus as man’s redeemer and that His blood cleanses one from all sins (*Ephesians 1:7; Colossians 1:14*), but one of the old-time hymns that we have learned and remembered and that we still sing today is the song entitled, “WHEN I SEE THE BLOOD.” The words of the first verse reads as such: “Christ our Redeemer died on the cross, Died for the sinner, paid all his due; Sprinkle your soul with the blood of the Lamb, And I will pass, will pass over you.”

Those who truly have been saved by the blood of the Lamb can most assuredly say with jubilation, “Our Redeemer lives!” Jesus lives!” He spilt His blood for all humanity, paying the sinful debt mankind incurred. Jesus unselfishly shed His blood on the cross of Calvary. He was the one and only perfect sacrifice, once and for all, for it was not possible that the blood of goats and calves could wipe out and redeem mankind from their sins. By His sacrifice, Jesus obtained eternal redemption for us all (*Hebrews 9:11-15*).

Jesus Christ, our Redeemer (*Isaiah 47:4*), the Holy One of Israel, was made flesh and dwelt among us (*John 1:14*) paying our debt (*I Corinthians 15:3,4*), delivering all who will come to Him from the bondage of sin (*Romans 3:25, 6:23*).

The introduction to the Book of Job, tells us that Job was a man regarded as perfect, upright, fearing God and hating evil. The quality or attribute of “perfect” describing Job does not mean he never sinned, for all men sin and come short of the glory of God (*Romans 3:23*). What the author was saying was that Job’s relationship with God was right, in that he lived by the Psalm that points out that “*The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring for ever: the judgements of the LORD are true and righteous altogether*” (*Psalms 19:9*).

God allowed Satan to test Job. Job’s livelihood, servants, sons and daughters all perished. Job was tested even further by being afflicted with boils from the sole of his foot to

the crown of his head. With all the calamities that had befallen him, Job was encouraged by his wife to curse God and die! Yet, in all this, Job sinned not with his lips nor did he charge God foolishly (*Job 1,2*).

Job, suffering greatly, answered one of his miserable comforting friends, “*For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God: Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; though my reins be consumed within me*” (*Job 19:25-27*).

Job had no certain hope of future life. Job could not be sure of what happened after death, but he had remarkable faith that he would one day see God. At this particular point in history, it may have been impossible or improbable for anyone to have a sure hope of everlasting life. But this hope of everlasting life became sure after the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and the wonderful message of the Gospel. The Gospel which is the Good News that Jesus saves! Jesus heals! Jesus baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire and last but not least Jesus is Coming Soon!

God sent His Son into the world that all would come to Him not willing that any should perish. Jesus, the Lamb of God, without spot, without blemish, the perfect sacrifice, shed His blood at Calvary, paying the penalty for all of mankind’s sins. He was laid in the tomb and arose from the dead and is alive forever more! Jesus is alive and because He lives, all who come in faith believing that He is alive, has that wonderful promise of eternal life. This is possible because our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ is our Redeemer!

Combined Evening Services: Easter, Lord Supper & Divine Healing

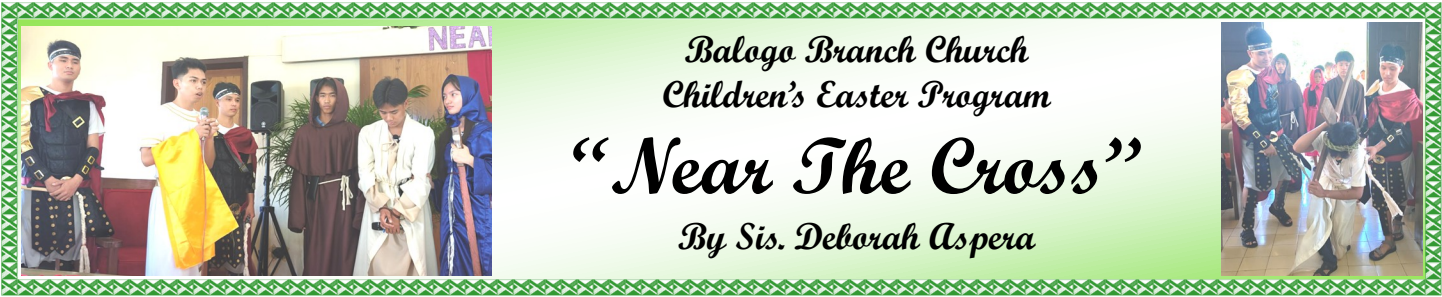
