
Lord." Colossians 3:16.

Christmas is here. People all over the world celebrate Christmas by busily decorating their Christmas tree, shopping, eating, drinking and making merry. Parents find themselves telling their children about Santa Claus. We all know, and the children find out sooner or later, that Santa Claus is a lie.

As for Christmas trees, the Lord said to learn not the way of the heathen (*Jeremiah 10:1-5*). The Apostle Paul tells us, they who indulge in heresies, drunkenness, revelries and such like, shall not inherit the Kingdom of God (*Galatians 5:19-21*).

Since Christmas is the season of giving and receiving, it can become extremely commercialized. It is the most profitable time of the year for various businesses and department stores. Many of us will spend countless hours making shopping lists and buying gifts for loved ones and friends. Millions untold will spend Christmas Eve running to the stores in panic to buy last-minute gifts.

I'm not knocking the buying, making or the giving of gifts but sometimes all those gifts for our children, friends and loved ones can bear such a financial burden, more so in these tough economic times. The Wise Men presented costly gifts fit for the baby Jesus, the King of glory: gold, frankincense and myrrh (Matthew 2:11). The gifts we purchase or craft today need not be costly, but we, too, could offer a costly gift: a gift that doesn't need wrapping, doesn't need to be assembled, is one size fits all, will not need exchanging, and, though the value of this gift is priceless, will not cost you a dime. The gift I'm referring to is God's gift to all mankind, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, for the purpose of the salvation of one's soul. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

From the very beginning of time God's presence filled the earth. Before anything was, there was God. He made the heavens and the earth, the waters, animal life, plant life, the sun, moon and stars and then He made man. Adam and Eve enjoyed the presence of the Lord. This Christmas season and everyday of our lives, let us "...come before his presence with thanksgiving, and make a joyful noise unto him with psalms" (Psalm 95:2), thereby assuring a joyful Christmas presence.

Jack Wright, Sr. was born on August 29, 1934 in Honolulu, Hawaii, and passed away at home, on October 19, 2025 at the age of 91. He was child "#7" out of 13. Pre-deceased is his late wife, Sis. Edna K. Wright. Surviving him is, 6 children, 23 grandchildren, 28

Great-grandchildren and 1 Great-great-grandchild.

Bro. Jack Wright Sr., led an eventful life. At the age of 7, he witnessed the "Day of Infamy (Sunday, December 7, 1941)" as Japanese fighter airplanes flew overhead. His education began at Kalihi Uka Elementary School and continued through St. Louis College and graduated in 1952. He was energetic and productive. Hobbies, playing musical instruments, selling news-papers and shining shoes are in his life's resume.

He was proud to be an American of Hawaiian descent, and served proudly in the Armed Forces of the United States of America.

He served in the Hawai'i Air National Guard, United States Coast Guard, and the United States Air Force before retiring from military service in 1973. He continued to be active as an employee at the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard and with the United States Postal Service.

He was a valued Serviceman in the Armed Forces ascending to the prestigious rank of Chief, and as a Civil Servant. Medals and Certificates of Commendation recognized and honored him.

Bro. Jack Wright, Sr., met the love of his life, Sis. Edna Kaleiwohiokalani Like. They were married on New Year's Eve in December 1956, in The Apostolic Faith Church, by the late Trustee/Associate Pastor Gus K.
